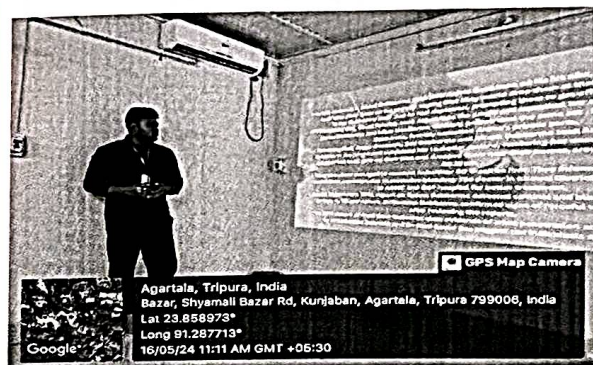


## Internship under Tripura Human Rights Commission, 2024
