#### Report

on the

Special Lecture: "The Evolutions of Women's Roles in India: From Ancient Traditions to Modern Transformation"

The Department of History, Holy Cross College, Agartala, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), successfully organised a Special Lecture on Wednesday, 11th December 2024, at 11:00 AM. The lecture, titled "The Evolutions of Women's Roles in India. From Ancient Traditions to Modern Transformation," was delivered by Dr. Madhumita Acharjee, Head-In-Charge and Assistant Professor, Department of Law, Tezpur University (A Central University). This academic endeavour formed an integral component of the Value-Added Course on the Indian Knowledge System, imparted as per the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, and aimed at enriching the curriculum for the students of NEP 1st and 3rd semesters at Holy Cross College, Agartala. A total of one hundred and twenty-three (123) students from the different Departments of the Holy Cross College, Agartala participated in the event

This landmark event was designed with the dual purpose of promoting intellectual exploration and fostering interdisciplinary connections under the innovative and student-focused academic framework established by the NEP 2020. Hosted in a **blended mode** to maximise participation, the session welcomed enthusiastic attendees physically at Holy Cross College and virtually via online platforms.

#### Purpose and Context of the Lecture

The Department of History has consistently sought to explore themes that resonate deeply with both academic pursuits and social relevance. By engaging the distinguished Dr. Madhumita Acharjee as the **Resource Person**, the Department aimed to guide students through an intellectual journey examining the shifting paradigms of women's roles within Indian society, from ancient traditions deeply rooted in cultural ethos to their transformative evolution in a modern, globalised world. This initiative supported the broader objective of the NEP 2020 to incorporate value-based learning modules that reflect India's rich civilisational heritage while addressing contemporary societal dynamics.

The lecture was not only positioned as an academic milestone but also designed to serve as a platform for fostering student engagement, developing critical thinking, and encouraging meaningful reflections on gender equity—an issue of paramount importance in modern Indian and global contexts.

#### Overview of the Event

The event commenced with a formal introduction delivered by the Respected I.Q.A.C. Coordinator of Holy Cross College, Agartala who welcomed the faculty, staff, and students present in the college seminar hall, along with the virtual attendees. Special mention was made of the NEP-aligned Value-Added Course on the Indian Knowledge System, designed by Tripura University, as an innovative endeavour offering students an interdisciplinary understanding of India's cultural, social, and political fabric.

Following the introductory address, **Dr. Madhumita Acharjee** was introduced with a detailed account of her academic credentials and professional expertise. A highly regarded scholar and seasoned educator, Dr. Acharjee's notable contributions span across diverse disciplines, including legal studies, gender issues, and Indian sociocultural transformations. Her work has been widely recognized for its rigorous scholarship and insightful analysis, which seamlessly blends historical perspectives with legal and social paradigms.

#### Highlights of the Special Lecture

Dr. Acharjee began her lecture by providing a thematic outline, identifying key eras in Indian history to explore women's evolving roles. Her analysis was categorized into three overarching themes:

- Women in Ancient India Examining the depiction and roles of women in Vedic literature, epics such as the Mahabharata and Ramayana, and sociocultural practices during the early Indian period. Dr. Acharjee highlighted instances where women enjoyed autonomy and respect, citing examples of key figures like Gargi, Maitreyi, and Rani Laxmi Bai while drawing parallels to systemic inequalities that arose in successive centuries.
- 2. Medieval Perspectives The lecture transitioned into a critical analysis of the constraints imposed during the medieval period due to sociopolitical changes, including the advent of patriarchy-driven practices such as purdah and the diminution of women's educational opportunities. Yet, Dr. Acharjee illuminated cases of female agency, focusing on trailblazers such as Razia Sultana and Meerabai.
- 3. Contemporary Transformations Dr. Acharjee articulated the groundbreaking shifts in women's roles since India's independence, tracing legislative changes from the Constitution of India to the recent endeavors for equal representation across domains. She discussed movements for education and employment, such as the Self-Employed Women's Association (SEWA), and women's visible presence in science, law, politics, and the corporate sector.

Throughout the lecture, she skillfully wove together threads from diverse disciplines, incorporating references to legal reforms (e.g., Hindu Succession Act, 2005), feminist literature, and contemporary statistical data.

#### Student Engagement and Discussion

Following the main lecture, an interactive session allowed students to engage actively with Dr. Acharjee. Participants raised pertinent questions concerning gender roles in educational settings, the efficacy of existing legal mechanisms protecting women's rights, and historical patterns of exclusion versus empowerment.

Dr. Acharjee responded with precision, emphasizing the interconnectedness of historical roots and contemporary realities. She encouraged students to view gender issues not merely through the lens of historiography but also as legal and ethical imperatives requiring proactive engagement. Faculty members echoed this sentiment, affirming the lecture's relevance in bridging theoretical discourse with practical challenges.

#### **Outcomes and Reflections**

The Special Lecture provided multiple takeaways for students and faculty alike:

- Broadened Perspectives: Students deepened their understanding of the cultural, legal, and historical forces that have shaped the trajectory of women's roles in Indian society.
- Critical Thinking: By engaging with complex themes spanning millennia, students were encouraged to adopt a more nuanced view of societal transformations.
- Interdisciplinary Learning: The lecture exemplified the NEP 2020 goals of breaking academic silos, inspiring students to explore intersections between history, law, and contemporary gender issues.
