



Speaker: Dr. Sharmistha Chakraborty, Assistant Professor, Holy Cross College

An insightful inter-departmental lecture series on Social Stratification was conducted by Dr. Sharmistha Chakraborty, Assistant Professor at Holy Cross College, with 29 participants from both Minor and Major 1st semester students. The session aimed to provide a comprehensive understanding of social stratification, highlighting its deep-rooted presence in society and its influence on people's access to resources, opportunities, and social mobility. Dr. Chakraborty began the lecture by explaining how stratification is a fundamental aspect of all societies, shaping social hierarchies based on factors such as economic status, caste, gender, education, and occupation. She emphasized that these divisions create structured inequalities, affecting individuals' quality of life, career prospects, and overall well-being. The discussion also explored how social stratification is not just limited to economic disparities but extends to various aspects of daily life, influencing political representation, healthcare access, and cultural perceptions. Dr. Chakraborty elaborated on the historical and contemporary dimensions of stratification, focusing on the evolution of societal divisions over time. She addressed the complexities of caste and classbased discrimination in India, the challenges faced by marginalized communities, and the persistent gap between different social groups. Additionally, the lecture examined how modernization, urbanization, and globalization have altered traditional social structures, sometimes reducing barriers while simultaneously creating new forms of inequality. The increasing role of technology in shaping social divisions was also discussed, particularly the emergence of digital stratification, where access to information and digital literacy further differentiate social groups. Throughout the session, Dr. Chakraborty stressed the importance of awareness and collective efforts in reducing inequalities and fostering a more inclusive society.

The event concluded with a vote of thanks, acknowledging her insightful discussion and valuable contribution to enhancing the understanding of social stratification. The lecture was highly engaging and thought-provoking, offering participants a deeper perspective on societal structures and their implications in the modern world.
