Introduction

Holy Cross College is a private Self-financed, Christian Minority Educational institution of higher learning, founded, animated and enlivened by the Congregation of Holy Cross. Holy Cross is a community of scholarship and faith, serving in the field of education worldwide since 150 years and in Agartala from 1970. It is anchored by a belief in the inherent dignity of each person. Holy Cross College is owned and managed by Holy Cross Educational Foundation(HCEF) registered (3612/2000) in accordance with the Societies Registration Act of 1860 to serve efficiently the people of northeast India and Tripura in particular.

Management

A College Managing committee assists the Governing Body of the College for its smooth and efficient functioning.

Aim

To educate the whole personality of youth, educating their hearts and minds, so that each Holy Cross student will think, act and lead with courage toward creating a just and peaceful society.

Blessed Basil Moreau (1799-1873)

Basil Moreau, the founder of the congregation of Holy Cross, was born in Laigne-en-Belin, a town in Le Mans, France on February 11, 1799. As a priest of the diocese of Le Mans and seminary professor, he established the Association of Holy Cross consisting of two societies, one of men (brothers and priests) and the other of women, both having as principal ministries, the education of youth. He was raised to the status of Blessed by the Church on September 15, 2007 for living heroic virtues in life. Through the leadership of Blessed Basil Moreau Holy Cross contributed greatly to the building up of France.



The men and women of Holy Cross maintain educational institutions as well as important social and pastoral ministries in countries all over the world. Holy Cross has a strong presence in Northeast India since 1853, the then undivided India. Holy Cross Universities, colleges and schools across the world are considered excellent institutions of learning.

Blessed Basil Moreau was an educator with very definite ideas about teaching and learning and about curriculum in terms of both content and methodology. "I have always been convinced that the first duty of every teacher is to produce good human beings; society has a greater need for people of values than it has for scholars. Knowledge itself does not bring about positive values, but positive values do influence knowledge and put it to a good use, he said"

A BRIEF HISTORY OF HOLY CROSS COLLEGE

Holy Cross College, Agartala, a Catholic English Medium Degree College was established in 2009 by Holy Cross Fathers who are the governing body members of Holy Cross Educational Foundation (2000) which is a registered society under the Societies Registration Act of 1860. This society came into existence with the objective of enabling the members of the Society of the Fathers of Holy Cross to efficiently serve the people of Tripura and northeast India through education.

Today, this non-profit foundation (HCEF) has under its umbrella over a dozen English Medium High Schools and many English Medium Higher Secondary schools serving a student population of over 25,000 in the northeastern states of Tripura, Mizoram, Meghalaya and Arunachal Pradesh. Holy Cross Higher Secondary School, Durjoynagar, Agartala, established in 1970 is our premier educational institution in Agartala, West Tripura.

The College is affiliated with Tripura University (A Central University). The Permanent Affiliation Reference number is: No.F.TU/DIR.CDC/HC/48/2014 dated 30.03.2016.

All the departments of the College, except the B.Ed (Teacher Education) moved to the new College campus at Jubatara, Lembucherra, Agartala in July 2015. The then Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tripura, Shri Manik Sarkar officially inaugurated the new campus of the College on July 09, 2015.

The College had a gradual increase in its enrolments. It began with the enrolment of 57 students in the first year which increased to more than 2000 students in the 15th year. The students hail from all over the state of Tripura and northeast India and abroad. Since the college does not discriminate and accepts students from all strata of society, there is a wide variety of students both girls and boys, students from various ethnic groups, religions, castes and creeds, thus making the college a miniature and colourful spectrum of the society of Tripura and northeast India. Our students are hailing from the General Category, OBC, SC and ST (19 different indigenous groups of Tripura.) What is special about Holy Cross College is that it's competent and dedicated teaching faculty, through their hard work and mentoring practices guide the students excel in their studies and other activities, The proof of excellence is the results the College brought forth continuously in the University examinations in securing across the streams. University medals. The college displayed its continued pursuit of excellence as it scored A+ NAAC Accreditation (Cycle:02) in the year 2023.

Affiliation and Accreditation

The College is affiliated with Tripura University, (A Central University). The College is Accredited by the NAAC with A+ Grade (Cycle:02.) , All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) and Recognised by NCTE & UGC with 2(f) & 12 (B) under the UGC Act of 1956

The College Emblem and the Motto

The spirit of the college has been encapsulated in its emblem, which has 6 distinct elements.

1. The Cross and anchor signify the Holy Cross identity of the College.
2. The symbol of the heart and the book with the burning flame above with its bright red rays signify the Holy Cross charism of 'Educating Hearts and Minds'.
3. The Latin words "Ad Deum Gloria" which is translated as 'To God be glory' signify the goal of education namely making students fully alive as human persons since "the glory of God is human fully alive" (St. Irenius, St. Augustine) emphasizing the commitment of the institution to academic excellence and to form persons of character.
4. The motto , 'Manavanama vikasaya samagrahayam sikhā' which is translated as ' Holistic education for human enhancement' captures the focus of the College.
5. The bamboo signifies the hills and the hills people of the northeast and the paddy represents the plains and the plains people of northeast India.

CAMPUS CULTURE:

12. Students should come with clean and proper uniform or dress with modesty and decency and avoid low-waisted pants.

1. General Norms:

- 1) As Holy Cross is marked by its family spirit the general behaviour and conduct of everyone in the campus is expected to be dignified and cordial, promoting brotherhood and harmony.
- 2) Ragging is a punishable crime under law and if ragging is found in any form or intimidation of any sort he/she will be expelled forthwith and the law of the land will take its own course of action.

- 3) Students should cultivate the habit of reading the instruction/notice on the notice board everyday as soon as they enter the college campus and before they leave the campus.
- 4) Dress Code: All students are expected to follow the dress code of the College.
- 5) The college campus is tobacco & alcohol free zone.
- 6) Students are not allowed to use the mobile phone during the classes without the permission of the concerned teacher.
- 7) Students must not join any club or society or involve in any engagements that would interfere with their studies without the prior permission of the "Principal/Vice-Principal (VP) / Academic Coordinator (AC)".
- 8) Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting within the College, or collect money for any purpose or to circulate among the students any notice or petition of any kind or paste it on the College notice board without the written permission of the Principal/ Vice-Principal.
- 9) Active participation in politics is not compatible with the academic life of students and as such students are not expected to indulge in public activities, which are of any political nature.
- 10) Students will not be permitted to make complaints in a body or present any collective petition, but are welcome to present their case, (if any) either individually or through their proper representative.
- 11) The medium of teaching-learning will be in English Medium.
- 12) The college offers remedial classes for deserving students as per their request and initiatives.
- 13) The college offers transport facilities to those who make the official requisition and pay the fees regularly.
14. Issuing of certificate takes minimum of two working days from the date of application.

17. it is mandatory for students to save their contact number in official names to be eligible to be part of official academic groups.
18. College does not take the responsibility of any electronic devices/ money or valuables brought to the campus . it is the responsibility of the students to securely keep their mobiles, purse, laptop etc and other valuables.
19. Students found to be involved in any form of violence in the campus will be suspended from the college hitherto investigation.
20. Students who share obscene pictures and materials in official social groups of the college or to faculty members or students of the college will be suspended from the college hitherto investigation.
21. Students who damage college property will have to reimburse the complete amount of the repairing charge or replace it if it is an equipment

ATTENDANCE

1. At Holy Cross College, regular attendance is absolutely mandatory. If any student is late for his/her class by more than 15 minutes, he/she is to be considered absent for that class. Attendance for all classes in a day is mandatory. Attendance will be taken separately for each class. Each class will be of 50 minutes duration. Attendance to 6 classes/periods will amount to a day's attendance.
2. 75% of attendance is compulsory for being eligible to appear in the internal assesment and to apply for the University Examinations. Those having less than 75% attendance will be considered non-collegiate.
3. Shortage of attendance will invite censures . Students may be permitted to make up for the certain percentage of the deficit academic hours by the following: Class seminars, assignments, community services and project submissions.

4. Students who are absent from classes for two weeks or more continuously without the written permission from the Principal/VP/AC, will be considered to have left the College. If they are permitted to join back, re-admission formalities will have to be strictly followed.
5. Monthly attendance bulletins are published through the College Notice Board. Students and parents must take note of their attendance status and do their best to ensure the required percentage of attendance.
6. In case of genuine need for leave of absence and the necessity can be foreseen, prior permission from the Principal is to be obtained through an application to the effect from the Parent/Guardian. In case the absence is due to sudden illness or any unforeseen reason, documentary evidence shall be produced on return, not later than 3 days after returning to the class.
7. The Principal reserves the right to reject the leave application if he is not satisfied with the authenticity and validity of the reasons stated/documentary proof submitted.
8. Attendance for college examinations/internal assessments is absolutely mandatory. Every student is directed to take the college examinations seriously. No student is allowed to leave the examination hall before the expiry of the time. The results of the Examinations along with the Attendance Status will be notified.
9. Attendance for departmental/co-curricular/club activities is compulsory and included in the College Attendance.
10. Students who are regular to the classes will be awarded appropriately.

FEE REGULATIONS:

1. All fees are to be paid online through the College App/College Website
2. Fees shall be paid on or before 15th of each month, a fine of Rs. 50.00 per month (cumulatively) will be levied on all late payments

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3. Transaction details for all the payments of Tuition and Transport Fees should be provided in the fee card and submitted to Account Section of the College for verification once in a Semester
 4. The College fees cover twelve calendar months in an academic year. No reduction is made for holidays or disruption of classes
 5. Students will not be allowed to sit for semester examinations unless all college dues have been cleared before the respective Semester examination
 6. Fees should be paid as long as the students' name is on the roll. Any student leaving the college without completing the course should inform the Principal through a written letter and collect the discontinuation confirmation
 7. Certificates will be withheld if the student has arrears of fees. Fees for the vacation months are to be paid in advance.
 8. Students joining the college during any semester have to pay all the fees of the semester.
 9. 5% concession on total monthly fees (excluding installments) will be given if the fees of the whole year (including installments) are paid at the beginning of the academic year (ie. within two months). This concession is not applicable for Transport Fees.
 10. If a Student leaves the college during any semester he/she is expected to clear the whole course fee as no student is expected to leave the institution without completing the course
 11. Reservation of Transport facility is granted for a minimum period of one academic year . If a student cancels transport facility in the midst of a semester, the student should pay fees for one academic year.

CANCELLATION AND REFUND POLICY:

Admission cancellations can be done at the College office from 11.00 am-12.00 noon upto one month after completing the admission formalities.No refund will be done to the students for the amount paid to the college during admission. To be eligible to collect TC, the student should be upto date with payment of fees with no arrears.

LIBRARY RULES:

The lifeline of an educational institution is its library. HCC encourages all students to make use of the library facilities to the maximum. For the organized and effective use of the Library, the following norms shall apply:

1. Working Hours: The Library shall be opened on all working days, from 09.00 am to 04.00 pm.
2. Every student/staff entering and leaving the Library must sign in and signed out in the Log Book/RF ID Machine placed at the counter.
3. The books from the Reference Section are not to be taken out of the Library. They are meant for spot reference only. For using a book from the Reference Section, the student may submit his/her ID card to the Librarian, and get the book issued for reference. The book shall be returned before the student leaves the library and the ID card claimed back.
4. A student may take a journal/periodical and leave his/her ID card in its place. The student may take back the ID on return of the journal/periodical to its proper place.
5. No books/journals/periodicals/newspapers other than the ones issued against one's library cards are allowed to be taken outside the Library.
6. No library materials will be issued against borrowed ID Cards. Book issues are done in person against one's own ID card.

7. A book will be issued for a period of one week only. The books may be returned on any day before the due date. Failure to return the book by the expiry date will cause hardships to others who are in need of the book. Hence, the delay in returning the books will invite a fine of Rs.5/- per day. One can renew the book only once and after a gap of one week, the student can take the same book, if available.
8. The Library books shall be handled with care, without causing any damage to them. Loss of book/damage should be notified to the Librarian immediately. Damages will have to be paid for the same. If a Library Book is lost, it has to be replaced with a new one within 14 days of the original due date for return. Any delay in replacing the book will invite additional fine. If not replaced, the cost of the current edition of the book +Rs.100 as penalty will be levied against the student.
9. Strict silence is to be maintained in the Library & reading room. In case of any need, they should meet the librarian.
10. Persistent defaulters of various library rules will have their library services suspended.
11. No Dues Certificate from the Library is a must for the issue of all Admit Card for the University Examinations.

Assessment of Students:

The College does continuous internal assessments of the students through regular tests, projects and assignments. The marks secured by the students at these assessments are considered along with their percentage of attendance before enrolling the student for University examinations. The examination committee's decision in this regard is final and binding.

To facilitate quality education at affordable cost, HCC makes every effort possible to route the available scholarships for eligible students. It has also instituted its own merit and financial awards as well as scholarships and endowments through the generosity of benefactors.

All awards/scholarships are meant for regular students in "good standing". A student in good standing is defined as follows:

- a. Minimum attendance of 75% in each semester.
- b. Satisfactory performance in academic and co-curricular activities.
- c. Good conduct worthy of a student of HCC on and off campus, as detailed in the handbook.
- d. Healthy and appropriate linkages and communications on social net-working sites.
- e. Abides by the rules and regulations of the College and other regulatory bodies in Higher Education.

15) General Provisions:

- a.** A student may also be allowed to sit for any Semester Examination as a Non- Collegiate candidate, if he/she has attended minimum 65% of classes held in Theory and Practical separately in each Semester and on deposits of requisite amount of fees determined by the University from time to time.

- b.** A student having attendance below 65% (65% Theoretical & 65% Practical classes) of the classes held in any Semester shall be declared as Dis-Collegiate and he/she shall not be allowed to appear at the Semester-I/ Semester-II/ Semester-III/ Semester-IV/ Semester-V Semester-VI and Semester-VII/ Semester-VIII Examinations and shall have to be readmitted.

- c.** No student will be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination of the University if he/she fails to secure minimum 40% marks in the Internal Assessment portion.

- d.** It shall be the duty of the Principal of the concerned College/Institute to announce in consultation with the Heads of the Departments the names of students who are found not eligible to appear in the End-Semester Examinations in the various courses due to non-fulfilment of the criteria of internal assessment and attendance.

- e.** The students shall be informed in advance about the schedule of Internal Assessment.

- f.** The affiliated colleges shall have to submit the Internal Assessment marks in prescribed mark-slips to the Controller of Examinations seven days before the commencement of End-Semester Examination of the University.

g. A candidate having practical paper shall have to submit compulsorily the Practical Note Books (signed by the concerned Teacher) at the time of examination. No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the Practical Examinations if he/she fail to produce Laboratory/ Practical Note Book duly signed by the subject teachers of the concerned College.

h. Principals of respective colleges will arrange to submit the filled in application forms along with requisite fees (after due authentication of the entries of the application form) to the Office of the Controller of Examinations, Tripura University within the stipulated date to be fixed by the Controller of Examinations.

i. No Application Form will be entertained after the expiry of the stipulated date.

j. At the time of filling up of application form a student shall have to read the instructions carefully laid down for appearing at the examination.

k. Admit Card for an examination shall not be issued to a candidate unless his/her application is duly complete in all respects.

l. A candidate appearing at any Semester Examination of the Undergraduate courses shall submit with his/her application form such fees as may be prescribed from time to time by the University.

m. A candidate who fails to pass/qualify or to present himself/herself at an examination or does not fulfill the requirements for the receipt of an Admit Card shall not be entitled to claim refund of fees.

n. A candidate who applies for admission to subsequent examination(s) shall be required to pay on each occasion such fees as prescribed by the University from time to time.

o. A candidate declared as Person with Disability (PWD) and visually challenged by the appropriate authority, shall be exempted from paying the fees for University Examinations.

An Amanuensis may be engaged for writing answer on behalf of such PWD Student with the prior written permission of the Vice Chancellor, Tripura University. Such Amanuensis shall be entitled to remuneration to be paid by the University as may be prescribed.

p. A student shall be deemed to have appeared in an examination whenever Admit Card is issued in his/her favour by the University.

q. An examination shall be held always under the current syllabus.

r. A candidate may apply for Re-Examination of particular course(s)/ Subject(s)/ Paper(s) only in the Odd to Odd and Even to Even Semesters, subject to withdrawal of his/her secured mark(s) of that course(s)/ Subject(s) Paper(s) under question.

s. A candidate may apply for Inspection or Re-evaluation of Answer Scripts only for Theory component/ part as per relevant rules in this regard.

t. Practical examination of a Semester shall ordinarily be held prior to the Semester-end examinations.

u. The candidate shall be awarded a Certificate/ Diploma/ Degree when he/she successfully earns the minimum required credits for the Certificate/ Diploma/Degree.

v. A Grade Card shall be issued to all the candidates after every semester based on the Grade earned. The course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of every semester and CGPA earned till that Academic Year will be displayed in the Grade card.

1. STUDENTS' COUNCIL

The Students' Council is a student body of the college, comprising of elected/nominated representatives who have been nominated by the students for their academic and co-curricular achievements and leadership skills. The core group consists of 14 members who are designated as the president, Vice President and councilors. Principal is the Chairperson of the Council. The extended Students' Council consists of all class representatives, academic coordinator and VP.

Procedure for membership in the Council:

The College practices a democratic system where by the students elect separately the class representatives, keeping gender parity. From among the class representatives the President, Vice President and Councilors are selected by the Management and teaching faculty of the College. The selections are done during the second half of the academic year and the Council members assume office from the day of induction and investiture ceremony. It continues its term during the ensuing academic year till the election and induction of the new council members.

Purpose

The purpose of the council shall be:

- To represent the students as a direct liaison between the students, the administration and the faculty.
- To inform the students about any matter concerning them.
- To provide an open forum for eliciting opinions.
- To protect students' rights.
- To provide orderly direction of students' council sponsored activities and to teach leadership skills for preparing future leaders.

Term:

The Council functions for one year term.

Functions:

- The Council's main objective is to provide assistance to the Principal and Faculty whenever needed.
- The Council shall assist the student's welfare sub-committees.
- Each member is responsible for and accountable to the Council and its Chairman.
- The Council plays a major role in the meticulous planning and organization of the various co-curricular activities of the College during the year.

2. NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (N.S.S.)

The National Service Scheme with its motto, "Not Me But You" underlies that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of the society as a whole.

Holy Cross College has one unit of NSS with a Program Officer (PO). The Program officer conducts classes for the students from time to time. In collaboration with the teaching faculty of various departments, the PO also organizes exposure programs, social awareness programmes, adoption of village, blood donation, cleanliness drives etc.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) aims to create organized, trained and motivated youths by developing qualities of leadership, team spirit, secular outlook, ideals of selfless service and spirit of adventure.

Institution:

The National Cadet Corps has its genesis in the "University Corps" which was created under the Indian Defence Act, 1917 with the aim to make up the shortage of the Army. In 1920, when the Indian Territorial Act was passed, the University Corps was replaced by University Training Corps (UTC). In 1942, the University Training Corps was renamed as the University Officers Training Corps (UOTC). In order to create a youth organization at the national level, a Committee under Pandit HN Kunzru was set up in 1946. Recommendations of this Committee paved the way for the formation of NCC. Thus, the National Cadet Corps came into existence under the National Cadet Corps Act XXXI of 1948 under the Ministry of Defence (MOD).

Aims of NCC

- To develop character, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service amongst the youth of the country.
- To create a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life and always available for the service of the nation.
- To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces.

Motto

The motto of NCC is "Unity and Discipline".

Activities

The activities of NCC can be broadly divided into the following distinct categories described below:-

- Institution Training.

Benefits of NCC Cadets

Defence Services

a) Vacancies reserved for commission in the defence Forces for NCC “C” certified holders:-

i. Army – IMA Dehradun, 64 vacancies every year through UPSC and SSB interview. OTA Chennai – 100 vacancies every year for Short Service Commission (Non Tech), no UPSC exam, only SSB interview.

ii. Navy – 6 vacancies per course. No UPSC exam, only SSB interview. Two years age relaxation for NCC “C” certificate holders.

iii. Indian Air Force – 10% in all courses including flying training courses. No UPSC exam, only SSB.

b) For ORS, Sailors, Airmen: 5 to 10% bonus marks awarded for recruitment.

General

c) Para Military Forces – 2 to 10 bonus marks awarded for recruitment.

d) Department of Telecommunications – Bonus marks awarded for recruitment.

e) NCC – Civilian Gliding Instructors, Cadet Instructors/Whole time officers.

f) State Government – Preference for State Services in certain states.

g) Industry – Many industries give preference to NCC “C” certificate holders for various jobs.

h) NCC Games – Cash awards to teams and individuals for excellence.

NCC Scholarship Scheme

Scholarship of Rs. 5,000/- each per annum to 500 deserving NCC cadets who have excelled in academics. Award of Rs. 3,000/- each to the best cadets and Rs. 2000/- each to the second best cadets in each group.

Annual Sahara Scholarship

a) Sahara Group of Companies have formulated a scheme for granting scholarship to cadets as under:-

- i.** Rs. 5,000/- each for 368 cadets of Junior Division/Junior Wing (JD/JW).
- ii.** Rs. 15,000/- each for 386 cadets of Senior Division/Senior Wing (SD/SW).
- iii.** Rs. 40,000/- each for 66 cadets for higher studies.

b) All cadets are to apply through their respective NCC Unit/Wing.

3. Orientation Program for Freshers (Capitals - centralized)

Orientation programme initiate new comers (Freshers) into the philosophy and ethos of the College. This program is aimed at the inculcation of a sense of responsibility. Students are given the vision of the college. There is an emphasis of continuous human resource development and apart from motivating a sense of unity amongst the students; a desire to draw out inner potentials is deeply and intensely felt.
