Concept note

The goal of the Seminar is to discuss or present the current issues, challenges and alternatives for sustainable Growth & Development. In this proposed national seminar we are planning to bring students, research scholars, academicians, industry personnel and various other experts in one platform to confer on the problems and its probable solutions on the aforesaid theme "Roadmap for Inclusive Growth & Development of Indian Economy".

As India is slowly moving towards service sector and contribute highest (53.89%) towards GDP, whereas, manufacturing sector including microand small enterprises has accounted for nearly 17% of India's GDP, but the sector has seen employment decline sharply in last 5 years - from employing 51 million Indians in 2016-17 to reach 27.3 million in 2020-21(Business Standard, 2021). Hence we can see, there is a shift from agricultural economy to

service-driven economy with almost no growth in industry, which is not a virtue; it is an outcome of policies that has hampered manufacturing and mining. With production costs rising in China, international buyers are looking for alternative sourcing destinations for manufactured products. If India, with its large labor force, is to seize this opportunity, it must nurture its industrial sector.

Our country is on the crossway of sustaining the pandemic in one hand on the other, to escalate the growth and development towards five trillion economies. It is quite often seen that the rebuilding process especially after pandemic is extremely challenging and making a roadmap for growth and development is very much essential. According to Gita Gopinath, MD IMF "the Indian Economy has been recovering but there's still quite a bit of gap between where it's right now and its potential in terms of the level of output that could have. There is underlying momentum where we should continue to see a recovery in consumption and investment. It's a gradual recovery compared to pre-pandemic trend.

Hence, there is ample opportunity for the research scholars and academicians from multidisciplinary (social science and humanities) to contribute ideas, issues and solutions based on research.

- The name, designation, correspondence address, email id, contact number of author(s) should be written in the abstract and in the title page of the paper itself.
- One participant can present one paper only.

Selected full length papers will be published in the form of an edited volume with International Standard Book Number (ISBN) for which authors would not hold any copyright and will be issued at a discounted price.
